FUNERAL OF PRIVATE RODIBAUGH LARGELY ATTENDED.

Large Sick List in Co. H—Much Indignation Expressed Against the Officers High in Command—Every Effort Made to Have the Boys Mustered Out.

VENTURA, Aug. 31.—[Regular Correspondence.] The funeral services of Private Frank H. Radibaugh were held this afternoon at the residence on Ventura avenue, Rev. E. S. Chase officiating. The cortege was one of the largest in the history of the city. The Ventura City Band, in the lead, played a dirge, then followed Cushing Post, No. 44, G.A.R., Sons of Veterans and firing squad of previous members of Co. H, N.G.C. The hearse was next in line, with the family and friends following. Four Sons of Veterans and two members of Co. H acted as pallbearers. The floral pieces were numerous and most beautiful. Military services were held at the grave. During the afternoon all places of business were closed.

The funerals of Privates Harry Flint and Gabriel Ruiz will be held on Friday. Their bodies will arrive tomorrow. Telegraphic report from Capt. A. W. Browne gives the following list of those sick: Connelly, Corey, Huston, Cook, Culpin, Mosgrove, Eagon, Rowlands, McGuire, Tilden, Russell, Mikesel, Lemne, Dutton, Mitchell, O. T. Jones, Sheldon, Sharp, Rampey, Wilson, Murray, Friend, Bates and Larison; absent with leave, Joy, Butler, Arnold, Wiltfong, Hunter, Waterman and Booth. Private Charles Eastin is in this city, having been discharged on account of total disability. The Native Sons of this city met last night and appropriated \$50 toward the funeral expenses of Gabriel Ruiz.

The expressions of feeling against those in authority at San Francisco show it to be intense, especially is this so of Col. Berry. The statements of Berry that the company boys do not want to be mustered out is also bringing forth much condemnation. Each member of Co. H has written to relatives or friends stating that they all are tired of being treated like dogs, and that they want to come home. The relatives and friends of the boys are now using all their influence to have the boys of Co. H mustered out. Senators White and Perkins are now working to that end. Congressman Barlow is at present in this city and his aid has also been obtained.
